

Indian Crafts

Be sure and read the Home Arts Rules and General Judging Standards before entering.

Department Rules:

1. Exhibitors must be an enrolled member of a recognized Native American Tribe. Proof to be provided upon request.
2. Exhibitors may enter as many exhibits in each class as desired. However, duplicative entries in the judgement of the department superintendent will not be accepted (e.g. two pairs child's leggings, two rawhide hackamores).
3. Articles made for competition must be the work of the exhibitor, completed in the last year and a half and not previously entered in the Fair.
4. Every article which is to be hung must be mounted and ready to be hung, with wire or hanger attached.
5. Collections of small items must be mounted securely on a base no larger than 10" x 12".
6. Articles for sale should be already priced and listed separately.
7. Follow Premium Book closely to enter in the proper classification.
