

# ELKO NOFAIR STOCKHORSE/BRANDING CONTEST

## News

Howdy All,

It is with a heavy heart, lots of debating and a decision that was not taken lightly that we have had to postpone the 100th celebration of the Elko County Fair to August 27- September 6, 2021.

Governor Sisolak has extended the current restrictions with no time limit as to when they will expire.

Declaration of Emergency Directive 021 - Phase 2 Reopening. Sections 10 and 22 forbid groups of more than 50 people in any indoor or outdoor area and do not allow public attendance at events.

In Phase 2, events with live performances and live performers will not be allowed with spectators.

Even with face coverings, social distancing, and all proper precautions in place we cannot follow most of the guidelines. The Governor, along with the Nevada Gaming Control Board, holds all control of gaming licenses. We cannot risk losing our current license or possibly ever attaining another one to continue with Live Horse Racing at the Elko County Fair in the future.

Although we did postpone 100th Celebration of the Elko County Fair, **we will be putting on the Elko NoFair Stockhorse and Branding Contest.** We are currently working out all the logistics and safety measures at this time to comply with the Governor's Covid 19 mandates, to have a gathering on Labor Day weekend.

The gathering will be the Elko Nofair Stockhorse & Branding Contest, moving ahead with some separate events including the branding contest (divisions-Open, Open Incentive, Women's, Co-Ed, Youth & Senior) livestock show and sale, some stock horse events, barrel racing, team roping, and muley roping.

Please see the enclosed information on the particulars of each event. There will be no prizes everything will be jackpot/added money only.

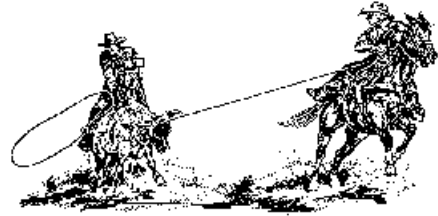

### SNAFFLE BIT-NON PRO CLASS

ENTRIES CLOSE 5PM THURSDAY SEPT 3RD

Herd work for all classes at 8:00 am

Rules for the Non Pro Snaffle Bit class are the same as the Open Snaffle Bit Class: Any rider showing in the Non Pro cannot show in the Open Snaffle.

No Limitation or amount of horses one rider can show provided it is owned by an Elko County resident. You can also show on other Nevada owned horse.

This is a non pro class, all non pro riders must own the horse they are showing or horse must be owned by an immediate family member (spouse, child, parents, or grandparents), or a ranch rider is employed at. Proof of current ownership required. A Non-pro is also defined as a person who is not currently receiving remuneration directly or indirectly for showing, giving lessons, clinics or assisting in the training of a horse for remuneration.

### SNAFFLE BIT-Open CLASS

ENTRIES CLOSE 5PM THURSDAY SEPT 3RD

Herd work for all classes at 8:00 am

Rein and cow work will follow after the Non Pro Snaffle rein and cow work as run entirely. Nevada Stock horses showing a five year old mouth or younger. For horses just starting, that have never been in any bit other than a snaffle bit. Horses must meet eligibility requirements. Two hands can be used. A Snaffle bit horse should be worked with a light hand. Horses must be worked with a snaffle bit, and the bit must have a leather curb strap. If reasonable proof is produced showing that the horse has ever been used with a bridle, the horse will be disqualified. Horses to be shown in the same manner as in the bridle class, as in arena work, and cattle work.

Horses may be mouthed before showing.

No Limitation or amount of horses one rider can show provided it is owned by an Elko County resident. You can also show on other Nevada owned horse. Other rules still apply.

Any rider can show two (2) horses in the Nevada Hackamore Novice or Nevada Hackamore class provided it is owned by a Nevada Resident. Other rules will still apply.

Nevada Stock Horses showing a 6 year old mouth or younger in a hackamore. For horses that have never been reined singly with a bridle and have not won in this class in any previous year. Horses must meet eligibility requirements. Standard rules will be used in judging. A rider riding a hackamore horse must ride two hands. If reasonable proof is produced showing that the horse has ever been used with a bridle, the horse will be disqualified. Horses may be mouthed before showing. Wires or bolts under the hackamore or wire over the hackamore nose piece are not permitted. Both the Non Pro and Nevada Hackamore Class will run together.

Rein and cow work will follow after the Hackamore classes rein and cow work has run entirely. Nevada Stock horses showing a seven (7) year old mouth or younger. Shown in hackamore and bridle combination worked together. Bridle must be curb or Spanish type. All horses must be ridden in standard equipment under standard rules.

Horses to be shown in same manner as in the bridle class. Horses may be mouthed before showing.

If a horse has ever been ridden straight up in any kind of bridle, and sufficient evidence can be proven, he will not be allowed to work or show in the two reined class.

Judged 100% performance on working cattle. No dry work as described under standard bridle equipment, no conformation points.

Horses must meet eligibility requirements.

Horses ARE NOT required to work on loose reins and are not to be judged under standard cutting horse rules, but are to be shown as contestant sees fit, to bring out the horses best performance in the work he is required to do. This class is to be conducted under as near actual range conditions as possible.

The class will consist of herd work and fence work.

## NEVADA COWHORSE 4 EVENT

ENTRIES CLOSE 5PM FRIDAY SEPT 4TH  
FOLLOWING THE CATTLE WORKING

To be shown with standard stock saddle and **age-specific headgear**. Will be judged on ability to perform work required for Nevada Cow horses. Work to be designated by the judge in accordance with rule adopted by the fairboard. In addition to a reining pattern, herd work and single cow work, the contestant will be asked to rope a yearling. This will be the last event of the class. The rider will ride into the arena with his rope tied up. He will build his loop while in the arena. Yearling will be released into arena. Rider will set animal up to his liking and may start down any side of the arena to a point designated by the judge before roping the yearling. The rider may use two loops. The **ONLY** legal catch is the head only. After the yearling is caught the rider must dally on a slick horn, stop and then pull the yearling approximately ten feet. Failure to catch the yearling will result in breaking the pattern. This is not a timed event. The same horse, rider, and equipment must be used in this event as in the other three events in this class. You may change saddles, and breast collars are acceptable. This event counts 25% of the overall score. Horses must meet eligibility requirements. **Age Specific Headgear.**

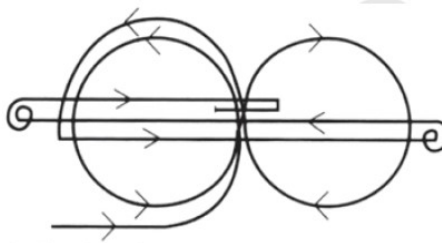

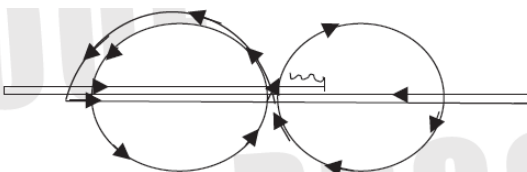

## ELKO UNFAIR BRANDING CONTEST RULES

1. **ENTRIES:** Womens/ CO-ED \$480/team \$120 per person  
Open \$500/team \$125 per person  
Senior \$200 per team \$100 per person,  
Youth \$30.00/team \$15.00 per person.  
Youth Age Groups 7-10 & 11-14  
45% stock & Office charge for all but youth division.  
Youth \$10.00 jackpot, \$20.00 cattle charge.
  - A. **All Entries Close on Monday August 31 by 5pm.** Entry fees must be paid at time of entry NO EXCEPTIONS!! No Team will be on the final list of entries until paid in full!! NO EXCEPTIONS.
  - B. Each entry must contain all team members names and contact information (**co-ed must also contain 2 males and two females, senior needs two members 55 & older and two ground crew any age, Youth will be one adult one youth two ground crew any age**) Two substitutes will be permitted per team; and must be listed on entry form however; Stock Horse Secretary must be notified of ANY substitutions prior to the start of eliminations.
  - C. Each person limited to enter only one team in each division (women's, open, and co-ed).
  - D. Absolutely no substitutes will be allowed during any heat that has commenced. If team is unable to complete the heat, the team will be given a no time. A team in any division of the branding contests may complete a heat with three members as long as the remaining participants are performing their function only once. For example, a team can finish the heat with one ground crew as long as ropers and ground crew have changed.
  - E. In all team divisions all contestants starting the contest must finish the contest. Only in the event of injury of personal crisis will an alternate be allowed to finish the contest and only upon approval of the stockhorse committee.
2. **TEAMS:** Each team will consist of a four (4) person crew: Two (2) to rope the first set, the other two (2) on the ground. Open, Co-Ed, Women's will then exchange places for last set. Seniors and Youth will not change places.
  3. **GROUND RULES:** Each team will head and heel a designated amount of calves. Open will head & heel Six(6), Women's and Co-Ed will head & heel four(4). Seniors and Youth will head & heel two (2). No tie downs allowed.
    - A. Slick saddle horns only, no rubber, rosin or foreign ingredients or objects; if found, disqualification from the event. KIDS ONLY ALLOWED TO USE RUBBER ON HORNS.
    - B. Legal catches are head only for Open, Women's, Seniors and Co-Ed divisions (catch is not considered illegal till header dallies), for all other catches the rope must be removed or fished clean by roper at the discretion of the team, and the animal must be roped again. No front legs allowed in any event.  
Youth— Horns, half head and front leg are legal.
    - C. All four feet must be within the stretch ropes; if a foot is lost it must be replaced in the rope.
    - D. Both front feet and both hind feet are the only legal stretch allowed before the calf is branded with iron or chalk.
    - E. Ground Crew can pick up a dropped head rope for the ropers without a penalty if the ground crew is back in the circle by the time the calf is healed.
    - F. After the calf is heeled, a dropped head rope can be picked up by the ground crew without the ground crew going back to the circle.
    - G. After each calf has been branded, the calf must stand on all 4 feet before the next calf can be roped.
    - H. On the last calf, calf had to be on his feet and free of rope, the iron back in the fire and ground crew in the ring before the judge signifies final time. It is the teams responsibility to see that all cattle are up and free of ropes before they call time.
    - I. No person but team and officials will be allowed in or around the arena. Only 2 horse holders allowed outside of pen. Failure to comply will be grounds for disqualification.
    - J. Once contest has started, no discussion with the judges allowed.
    - K. Time will only be called in the pen or pens that are affected by a fence down or an injured animal or contestant.
    - L. A lost rope must be returned to the original roper.
    - M. An Elko County Fair Board branding iron will be furnished.

## ELKO UNFAIR BRANDING CONTEST RULES CONTINUED:

### 4. PENALTIES:

- A. 20 second— not walking to the edge of the herd for each calf.
- B. 30 Second—per incident if ground crew leaves designated area before the calf has been headed and heeled.
- C. 30 Second— for a light brand
- D. 30 Second— per incident for heavy or improperly placed brand
- E. 30 Second— for any iron that contacts the ground for any reason out side of the circle.
- F. 30 Second—per incident if a horse is ridden through the designated area set by the committee.
- G. 30 Second—if the last calf roped does not stand before the next calf is roped.
- H. 90 Second— for undue roughness with calves. A second incident disqualifies the team.
- I. 60 Second— failure to properly recity or remedy an illegal catch.
- J. 60 Second- Per incident for an upside down brand.
- K. Disqualification for branding on the wrong side.

### 5. ELIMINATIONS:

Women's & Open Eliminations Friday September 4th

CO-ED Eliminations Saturday September 5th

Youth competition Saturday September 5th before the CO-ED

Senior competition Sunday September 6th before the Finals.

### 6. COMPETITION: TIME BASIS— 12 MINUTE TIME LIMIT FOR OPEN, WOMEN'S AND CO-ED. 8 MINUTES FOR SENIOR AND YOUTH.

OPEN will rope 6 calves and the six fastest teams will compete in the finals.

Women's & CO-ED will rope a total of 4 calves. The 3 fastest Women's teams will go to the finals. The top (6) CO-ED Teams will go to the finals.

Seniors and Youth will not have an eliminations.

A team will be disqualified if they don't rope and brand all calves in their division. Times in the finals will be on that day only. No average will decide the Open Incentive Championship.

**7. FINAL DECISION AND DISPUTES:** The Elko County Fair Board Stockhorse Committee shall have the final decision on any disputes about entries, penalties, procedures, and event as whole. In case of dispute, a team puts up \$50 to the stockhorse secretary; upon receipt the stockhorse committee will hear the complaint for a decision. If the committee rules in favor of the team the money will be returned if not the money is put into the pot. Any person desiring to file a complaint regarding any alleged violation of the rules may do so within an (1) hour of the completion of the event. (An event being eliminations, semi finals or finals. ) Rules of the judge an stockhorse committee are final. Any dispute with the judges will result in disqualification.

- B. Pay Three places 50%, 30% 20%

### CO-ED BRANDING: Limit 30 teams

- B. Top 6 go back to the finals, money will be split 50%, 30%, 20%

### OPEN BRANDING: LIMIT 30 teams
