The guys come back this coming Monday. He is having trouble with crew people due to wages and the guys need a little wage raise. This past weekend he had Cinco De Mayo which is the first big event. The carnival that is here is paying a percentage after \$25,000. The spring market that happened a couple of weekends ago brought \$2900. At some time, the lawn has been messed up by pouring something on it and he is going to have to get that dug out and repaired. The hay field the grass on the hay field is horrible and he disked it, raked it and weed killed the whole thing and is spreading seed to get something growing. Nothing else to report.


