ELKO COUNTY FAIR

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Grounds Manager and Fair Board Members will be on the grounds during the Fair and the entire supervision of the grounds will be vested in them. Supervision of the racetrack will be vested in the Board of Stewards.
2. The sale of all tickets will be vested in the Admissions Superintendent, or in an assistant the Superintendent may appoint.
3. The Elko County Fair, its Boards, its employees, its agents and its volunteers will not be responsible for accidents or losses which may occur from any cause whatsoever.
4. Any exhibitor, whether commercial or otherwise, exhibits at the sole discretion and only with the express written permission of the Elko County Fair Board. Any unauthorized exhibits will be

removed immediately. The Fair Board reserves the right to have removed any exhibit which, in its sole judgement, is inappropriate to display at the Fair.

5. All concessionaires and special exhibitors must secure a permit and contract from the Elko County Fair Board and shall occupy such booth or grounds as assigned. Any health permits needed are exhibitors' responsibility. All sales are subject to Nevada sales tax.
6. The Elko County Fair Board reserves the right to refuse admission or have removed any person who, in the Board's judgement, is detrimental to the health, safety or enjoyment of other Fairgoers.

HOW TO ENTER A HOME ARTS EXHIBIT

1. **Any Nevada resident can enter an exhibit** for judging in the Home Arts competitions.
2. Read this premium List carefully and determine which Department(s) and Class(s) are of interest to you. Understand the rules and judging standards for Home Arts overall, and for each department you're considering entering. Be sure and keep this Premium List as you will need to refer to it before the Fair.
3. When you prepare your exhibit for entry, **be certain that it is ready to be displayed based on the rules for each individual department.** Exhibits that are NOT ready to display according to the guidelines listed in this Premium Book will not be accepted. Every item which is to be hung must be mounted and ready to hand for display.

Cut the lines with Online Entries!!

We're making it easier for busy would-be Fair exhibitors to enter the Home Arts competitions! Save yourself a lot of time on entry day by pre-entering your exhibits online. Go to the Fair's website, www.elkocountyfair.com, and click on "How to Enter" link, and follow the instructions. It's that easy! You can go back at any time to add or delete entries, also, up until 12:00 midnight, Wednesday, August 31st. You can register your entire family at once, too, so you only have to run your credit card once. The cost to enter is \$7.00 per exhibitor, per 10 items. If you have more than 10 items to enter you will be charged and extra \$5.00 entry fee for 10 more items.

Whether you've entered online or may want to do it in person the way we've always done it, bring your entries to the Goicoechea Home Arts Building during check-in hours. We'll get you your exhibit tags and make sure your entries get where they're supposed to go.

Remember – you DO NOT have to enter online!! If you're not comfortable doing it that way, or if you miss the online deadline – relax! Bring your exhibits to the Exhibit building during check-in hours, and our helpful volunteers will get you in!

4. Bring your exhibit(s) to the Home Arts Department on the designated registration days and times. Entries will not be accepted after the closing time. Each exhibitor will be asked to pay a \$7.00 entry fee per exhibitor. Exhibitors may enter up to 10 items per the \$7.00

entry fee. Each additional 10 entries will cost \$5.00 more.

All exhibits MUST be in place by 5:30 PM Thursday, as judging will begin immediately afterwards. No exhibits will be accepted after this time.

5. Home Arts will re-open to the public Friday afternoon, September 2nd, at 1:00 PM. All contestants can see the results of the judging at that time.
6. All entries in Home Arts must remain on display until Monday at 3:00 PM. Exhibitors removing their entries before that time will forfeit all premium money they have won. Exhibits must be removed before 6:00 PM Monday September 5th. Bring your entry receipt to claim your exhibits. No exceptions.
7. Premium money is paid out Monday from 9AM - 6PM. Any premium money not collected by 6PM Monday will be forfeited. No exceptions. You **MUST** bring your entry receipt(s) in order to collect your premium money. Staff will be there to check your entry receipt against the Judge's Report and will pay out cash for all winning entries. Possession of ribbons and/or award cards does not entitle the holder to premium money. Premium money is paid on exhibits as shown and awarded in the Judges' report.

HOME ARTS GENERAL RULES

1. All exhibits entered in competition must be the work of the exhibitor, completed in the last two years, and not previously entered in the Elko County Fair.
2. All articles will be subject to approval, by the Supervisor or Superintendent in charge, before entry. The Home Arts Committee reserves the right to reject any entry deemed unsuitable for exhibition.
3. All exhibits must be in good condition and must meet the regulations outlined in this Premium List.
4. All exhibits must be properly labeled for identification according to the rules for each department.
5. Ribbons, cards, and trophies must remain attached to exhibits while on exhibition.
6. Parents with young children are requested to hold children's hands while touring the Exhibit Buildings. This will prevent accidents which could cause damage to exhibitor's work.
7. Department Superintendents are not in charge of selling articles at the Fair, with the exception of Indian Crafts. If you wish to sell your exhibit, ask a volunteer to help you put a "for sale" sign, the price, and your phone number on it **AFTER** judging and exhibits open to the public.
8. Elko County Fair is not responsible for loss or damage.
9. Any exhibitor or person showing disrespect to any Fair Volunteer, superintendent, judge, or any person will

forfeit all awards made to them and be asked to leave the premises.

10. These rules apply to all Home Arts departments. Each department has rules and judging standards specific to it, and exhibitors should read, understand, and adhere to those rules, as well.
11. Age divisions per department is as follows:
 - a. ADULT – 18 years of age and over
 - b. JUNIOR – 14-17 years of age
 - c. YOUTH – 9-13 years of age
 - d. CHILD – 8 years of age and under

**GENERAL
JUDGING RULES**

1. Follow the premium list closely and enter in proper classes. Exhibits entered in improper classes will not be judged and will be ineligible for premiums.
2. Check and re-check each departments' standards for exhibit display. Exhibits that are not ready to display will not be accepted, and those exhibits not displayed according to department standards will receive a significant scoring penalty.
3. Ribbons and premium money will be awarded as follows:

BLUE will be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit, with a prize of \$7

RED will be awarded to the second highest scoring exhibit, with a prize of \$5.

WHITE is awarded to the third highest scoring exhibit, with a prize of \$2.

SPECIAL AWARDS will be awarded to superior exhibits from the Blue-ribbon group at the discretion of the judges. This ribbon includes a prize of \$15

SWEEPSTAKES AWARDS will be awarded to superior exhibits from the SPECIAL awards group at the discretion of the judges. This ribbon includes a prize of \$25.

CENTENNIAL AWARD (TBD)- \$100.00 and Ribbon for "Best of Show" in each Department

4. Superior articles may receive special recognition when recommended by the Superintendent of the department and

approved by the General Superintendent.

5. Judges are instructed not to award first premiums or special awards unless exhibits are deemed worthy of those premiums. Judges may award a second premium, or none, according to their judgment.
6. Doors will be closed at 5:30PM on Thursday for judging and will remain closed until 1:00 PM Friday. No exhibitors will be allowed in the exhibit building during judging. All judges' decisions are final.

PLANT PRODUCTS RANCH, RANGE & TOWN

Department A

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. Exhibitors may enter as many exhibits as desired in each Class, but may not enter more than one of each type of plant in each Class (i.e. one exhibit of Granny Smith apples and one exhibit of Golden Delicious apples are fine, two exhibits of Golden Delicious apples are not.)
2. Prizes will be awarded or withheld at the Judge's discretion.
3. Entries must be exhibited by the grower and must be grown in Nevada. Persons entering exhibits for others must give name, address and exhibitor number of the grower.
4. Select uniform, insect free, disease free and clean specimens. Judges may taste entries for quality.
5. All exhibits must contain the following number of specimens:
 - a. An exhibit of apples, peaches or pears shall have 5 specimens; apricots, crab apples, plums and prunes, 10 specimens; berries, 20 specimens.
 - b. An exhibit of herbs shall be 5 stems.
 - c. An exhibit of vegetables shall be:
Beans and Peas – 15 pods
Cabbages and Lettuces – 2 heads
Cauliflower, eggplant, pumpkin for pie – 2 specimens
Corn, peppers – 3 specimens
Freak vegetable – 1 specimen

Heaviest categories – 1 specimen
Radishes, cherry or plum tomatoes – 10 specimens
Squash – 3 small or 2 large
Stock vegetables – 3 large
All others – 5 specimens

Additional Rules for Vegetable Exhibits:

1. Exhibits will be judged based on quality, number of kinds of plants, educational value, attractiveness of display and ingenuity of the exhibitor.
2. Each exhibitor may use a wall or table space not to exceed nine (9) square feet.
3. Exhibitors may enter multiple educational exhibits but may not enter more than one exhibit per theme.
4. Each educational exhibit is to be built around one of the following themes:
 - a. **Crop Forages** – an exhibit of crops raised for livestock forage
 - b. **Small Garden Display** – for exhibitors who have six or fewer entries in the vegetable Class.
 - c. **Cultivated Herbs** – an exhibit of herbs grown for cooking or medicinal purposes.
 - d. **Wild Plants** – Edible or Medicinal – an exhibit featuring native wild plants that have food and/or medicinal value.
 - e. **Weeds** - An exhibit displaying noxious or pest weeds found in the yard, field or range.
 - f. **Range Plants for Livestock** – an exhibit of native plants of forage value for livestock grazing.
 - g. **Range Plants for Wildlife** – an exhibit of native plants of forage value for wildlife.

Additional Rules for Forage In Sheaf:

1. The exhibitor is responsible for ensuring that his/her exhibits are identified correctly and entered in the appropriate Class.
2. Exhibits should be well cured (dried) and should be tied securely but not tightly at the butt, the middle and below the heads.
3. Use a uniform string or ribbon – no bailing twine please.
4. Forage plants should be selected for quality as feed, not simply large size.
5. Retain all leaves on specimens and avoid coarse stems.
6. Specimens should be clean (only the variety called for present in the sheaf).
7. Alfalfa and clovers should have five stems and the blossoms should not have yet gone to seed.
8. Grasses and grains cut for hay should be gathered before the heads are mature (before they start to turn tan or yellow).
9. Wheat, rye and oats cut for grain should have fully mature heads.
10. The following forages will be accepted. Please be sure to identify the Class when you enter. In order to avoid duplicative exhibits, each exhibitor is limited to ONE exhibit for each type of forage.

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. Each entry must be one whole item or the specified number of small items:

Cupcakes: 6

Candies: 12 or 1/2 pound

Cookies: 12

Doughnuts: 6

Pastries: 6

Rolls: 6

2. Each individual entry must be in a plastic bag with a twist tie (not tape or ziploc) on a paper plate.

3. Persons entering exhibits for others must give name, address and exhibitor number of the baker.

4. No mixes, canned fillings, canned frostings or other shortcuts are allowed except as noted in the decorated class.

5. Be considerate of others, have ALL your entries wrapped and properly prepared at home before arriving at Home Arts Building.

6. Anyone may enter the Open Class. Teachers, professionals and department judges MUST enter this Class. This Class is not eligible for Special Awards.

7. Exhibitors may enter as many exhibits as they want in each Class; however, duplicative entries will not be accepted (e.g. two chocolate Bundt cakes, two plates of brownies.)

8. Unattractive food displays will not be accepted or shown.

Be sure and read the Home Arts Rules and General Judging Standards before entering!

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. Judges may or may not open and taste entries, at their discretion. If you wish to provide a separate tasting jar, please indicate that when you enter your exhibit.
2. Exhibitor's name and address, the kind of entry and the date of canning must be plainly and securely placed on the bottoms of all containers. Adhesive tape is acceptable.
3. All entries must have new rings and clean bottles and must be properly sealed. If your entry is not sealed it will not be judged. No hot entries will be accepted.
4. Regulation containers must be standard one-half pint, pint or quart jars. Uniform jars for "collection" entries are required. Entries should NOT have paraffin or decorations.
5. Products with mold or that are otherwise visibly spoiled will be disqualified.
6. Because we have no way of refrigerating entries, all canned goods must be shelf stable. "Solar", "refrigerator" or "freezer" recipes cannot be accepted. Any jars that have been opened will not be displayed.
7. Unattractive food displays will not be accepted or shown.
8. Exhibitors may enter as many exhibits in each Class as they wish.
9. Follow premium list closely to enter in proper Class.
10. Entries in Combined Collection must contain three jars from a single Class. All jars must be uniform.

Be sure and read the Home Arts Rules and General Judging Standards before entering. Read the Premium List closely to ensure you have entered in the right Class!

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. All entries must be properly labeled for identification.
2. Articles entered should not have the name of the exhibitor visible, otherwise article cannot be judged. Exhibitor's name may be covered with masking tape.
3. Every article which is to be hung must be mounted and ready to be hung, with wire or hanger attached. Be careful that your exhibit is clean and well-presented to the judges.
4. Open work should be displayed on stiff colored paper. Do not display on cellophane.
5. Collections of small items must be mounted securely on a base no larger than 12 x 18 inches. ALL collections/sets must be joined together by means of hangers, wire, string, etc. and ready for display BEFORE arriving at the Fair. Multiple-piece sets that are not connected will not be accepted unless each item is being entered in separate categories.
6. Articles made for competition must be the work of the exhibitor, completed in the last two years, and not previously entered in the Fair.
7. Exhibitors may enter multiple items per Class; however, duplicative items in the judgement of the department superintendent will not be accepted.
8. All Bedspreads and Coverlets must be made from crochet thread. Blankets should be entered in Household Items.

9. Anyone may enter the Open Class. Teachers, professionals and department judges MUST enter this Class. This Class is not eligible for Special Awards
10. All items entered in knitting classes should be knitted entirely by hand. Any items knitted using a knitting loom or knitting machine should be entered in the appropriate classes in Yarn Crafts.
11. All items entered in Yarn Crafts classes must be made with yarn, string or thread of some kind. Other materials may be used to add interest or variety, but the yarn, string or thread must be proportionally greater than other materials used. Felted items must be made from yarn, NOT from the fiber itself and NOT from fabric.

All flowers will be received in the Flower Building from 8:00 am-5:30 pm, Thursday. There will be no Wednesday acceptance hours for Flowers exhibits. Exhibitors may pick up entry tags Wednesday night and bring their exhibits Thursday.

Exhibitor must first pay the registration fee and obtain an exhibitors' number in the Home Arts Building.

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. All decisions of the judges shall be final. Judges may or may not award premiums at their discretion.
2. Exhibitors may enter multiple exhibits in each Class; however, duplicative entries will not be accepted (two small container gardens, two arrangements on the same theme, two of the same cultivar).
3. Exhibitors must identify each exhibit's cultivar or theme in the Class field of the online entry form, or in person if entering in person.
4. Exhibits must contain the exact number of specimens specified in the Premium List. Any other quantities may disqualify an exhibit.

ANNUALS and PERENNIALS

Varieties with blooms <8" - 3 stems

Varieties with blooms >8" - 1 bloom/stem/spike

ROSES - 1 bloom or spray

BULBS/TUBERS - 1 bloom/spike

5. The Elko County Fair Board will not be responsible for loss or breakage of containers or accessories.
6. The Committee shall have the right to remove any exhibit which has become unsightly, to keep up the appearance of the Fair.

7. Entrants must use clear glass containers for their exhibits. Containers must be marked underneath with the name of exhibitor and Class number. Use a container that is proportionally sized to the flowers it contains (i.e. small flowers in small container, etc.)

8. Exhibits entered in the wrong Class or Category will be disqualified. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to read the premium list, follow the instructions and know what Class each entry belongs in before bringing in your exhibits.

9. Foliage must be attached to all flowers except sweet peas, tuberous begonias and bells of Ireland. Please remove foliage below the water line.

10. Exhibits calling for more than one stem should have stems cut the same length.

11. Greenhouse plants must have been grown by the exhibitor or must have been in his or her possession for a minimum of four months.

12. Foliage must be clean, but not polished with oil or any plant preparation.

13. Within each Class, like will be judged against like. For example, climbing roses will be judged against other climbing roses, ball type dahlias will be judged against ball type dahlias and not against cactus dahlias.

14. Exhibits with insects or disease will not be allowed in the competition and must be removed from the premises.

Additional rules for Garden Club

Sponsored Displays:

1. Garden Club Sponsored Displays are open to ALL exhibitors, not just members of the Elko Garden Club.
2. Exhibitors may enter multiple exhibits in the Garden Club Sponsored Display Class, and are encouraged to do so. However, in order to avoid duplicative entries by individual exhibitors, exhibitors are limited to one of each category. Displays must be identified in the Sub-Class area

of the online entry form, or when you enter in person.

Additional rules for Artistic Arrangements:

1. An exhibitor is permitted one entry per theme. Please identify theme for each exhibit in the Class field of the online registration form.
2. Fresh and dried plant material to be used in all arrangements. No artificial flowers, foliage or fruits may be used.
3. Flowers and plant material may be self-grown or purchased by the arranger in Elko County.
4. A minimum of painted or treated plant material allowed.
5. The Show Committee and the Fair Board will not be responsible for loss or breakage.
6. Each theme and exhibitor Class will be judged separately,
7. **Themes for the 2022 Artistic Arrangements Competition will include the following. Please denote the theme of your entry in the sub-Class area of the online entry form, or when you enter in person.**

Non-compliance with this rule will disqualify the entrant from entering any of their work in this department for a minimum of one year. No exceptions.

DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. Entries taken with a mobile device (tablet or phone), digital cameras, film cameras or drones are accepted.
2. Photographs must be printed and matted securely on a backing board, foam core or single or double-weight mat board. Ensure your work is mounted cleanly and securely without rough edges.
3. All entries must be clearly marked on the back with exhibitor's name, address, phone number, division, class and category
4. Size of photographs must be between 5"x7" and 8"x12". Panoramic photographs must be between 8"x16" and 8"x24".
5. Photographs must have been taken by the exhibitor within the last two years. Matting may have been done by someone else.

Photographs may be disqualified for the following:

1. Prints are matted with a border or in a frame.
2. Prints are falling off the backing board or edges of board are roughly cut/trimmed.

3. Work that includes any sort of border around the photograph, either trim or inserted by software or editing apps.
4. Photographs bearing any words or date stamps.
5. Prints are in an odd shape such as ovals, circles or triangles.
6. Images printed on cloth, wood, metal, glass or any other object are prohibited. Please enter these type of items in the Fine Arts or Hobbies & Crafts departments.
7. Photographs must not have been exhibited previously at the Elko County Fair.

JUDGING STANDARDS:

Each photo entry is judged as follows:

- 25 points - Overall Impact** – photograph's subject matter and style stands out among all other entries and is engaging to the viewer.
- 25 points - Originality & Creativity** – photographer's approach to the subject matter shows thought, is interesting, and utilizes unique points of view to tell a story within the boundaries of the camera's frame, engaging the audience.
- 25 points - Technical Quality** – photograph's primary subject is in focus, has appropriate lighting, follows basic rules of composition, and is free of distracting objects.
- 25 points - Matting & Display** – photograph is securely attached to a board without gaps or bubbles with no more than ¼-inch of the print over of the board, and mat board has clean, smooth edges.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

Color – The photograph has been taken with color film, digital camera, or device (phone, tablet, or drone)

Black & White – The photograph was taken on black & white film or has been transformed to a pure black & white image using software or an app

Sepia –The photograph has been transformed into a reddish-brown or yellowish-brown monochrome tint, creating an antique/vintage look to the image

Digitally manipulated/enhanced – The original photograph has been heavily edited or processed to create a new image, not limited to having other images copied and pasted within the picture by software or darkroom methods

Specialty paper – The image entered must be printed on a material such as metallic, gold, silver gelatin or any type other than standard glossy, matte, pearl, or luster papers.

Note: Minimal digital photo manipulation/alteration is accepted for all entries. This includes burning, dodging, exposure, contrast and color adjustments, cropping, stitching (for panorama only) and HDR processing
